Construction legislation in Canada continues to evolve, challenging companies and individuals to stay one step ahead of developments. The provinces have also undertaken steps towards reform. In December 2017, the Ontario legislature adopted Bill 142, the *Construction Lien Act Amendment Act, 2017*. The British Columbia Law Institute has begun a Builders Lien Act Reform Project, involving both a comprehensive review
